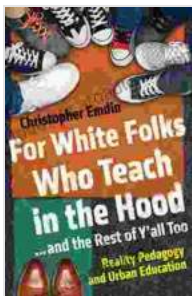

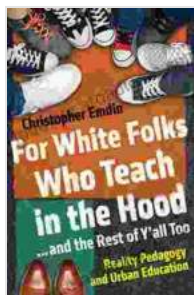
About the Authors
