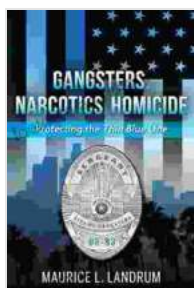

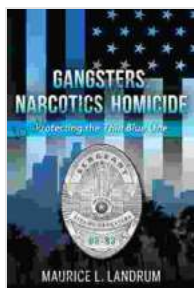
The Road Ahead
