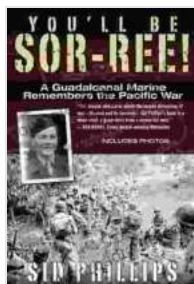

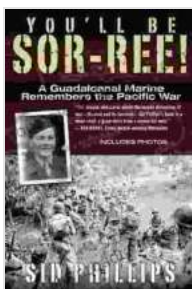
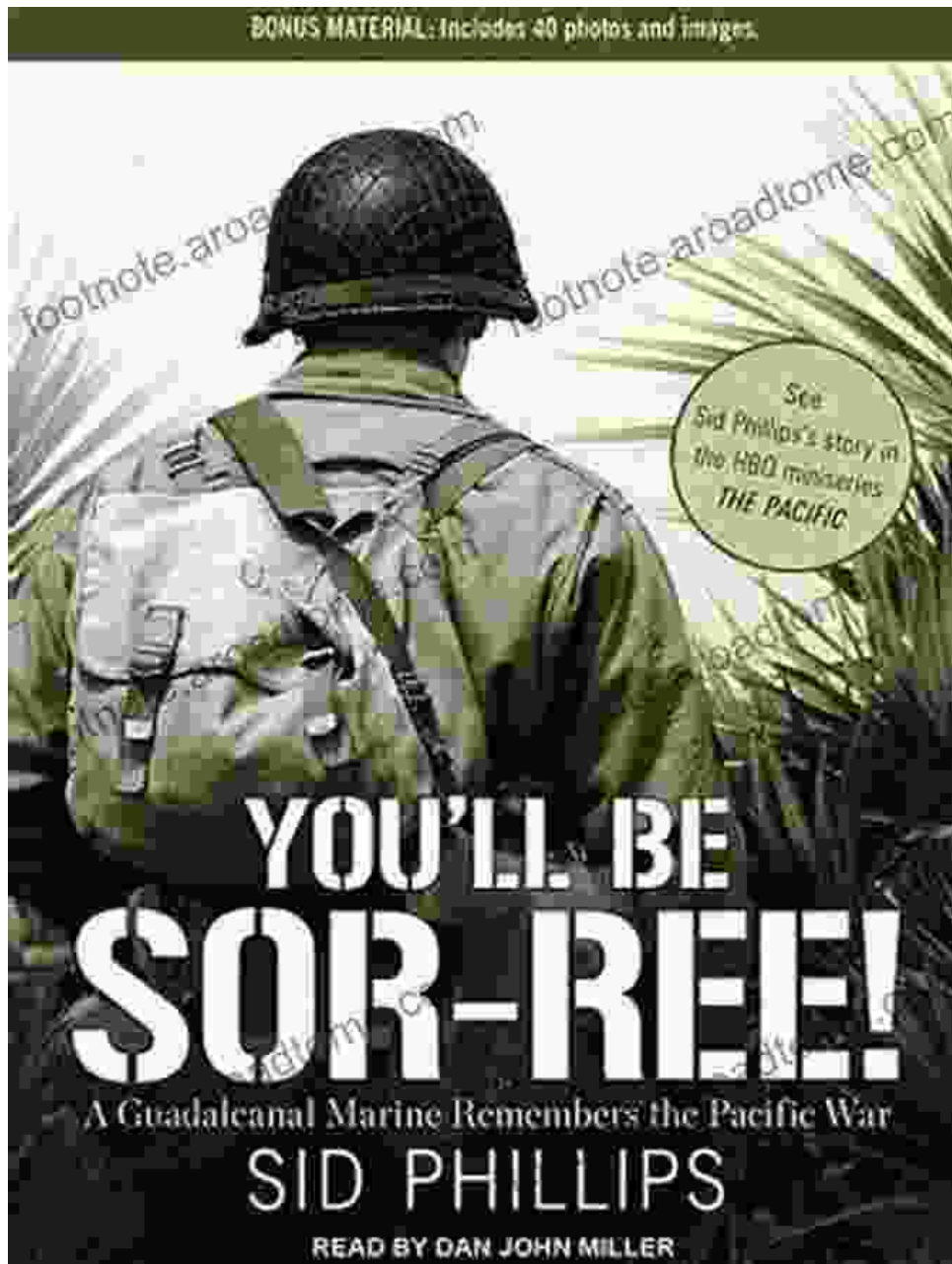
About the Author
